## Low Ceilings

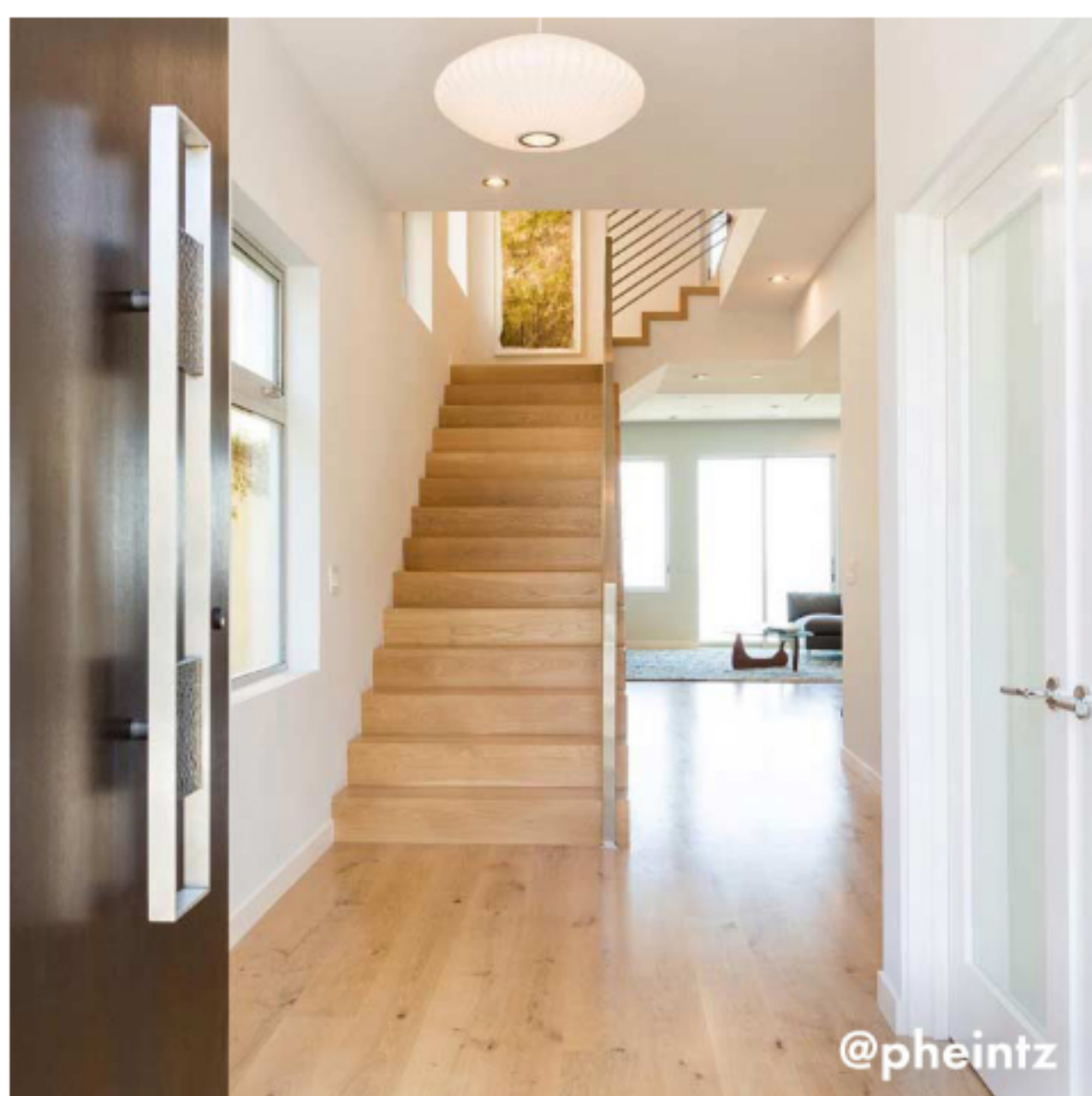
For ceilings under 9 feet, keeping fixtures close to the ceiling will do wonders for overhead space.

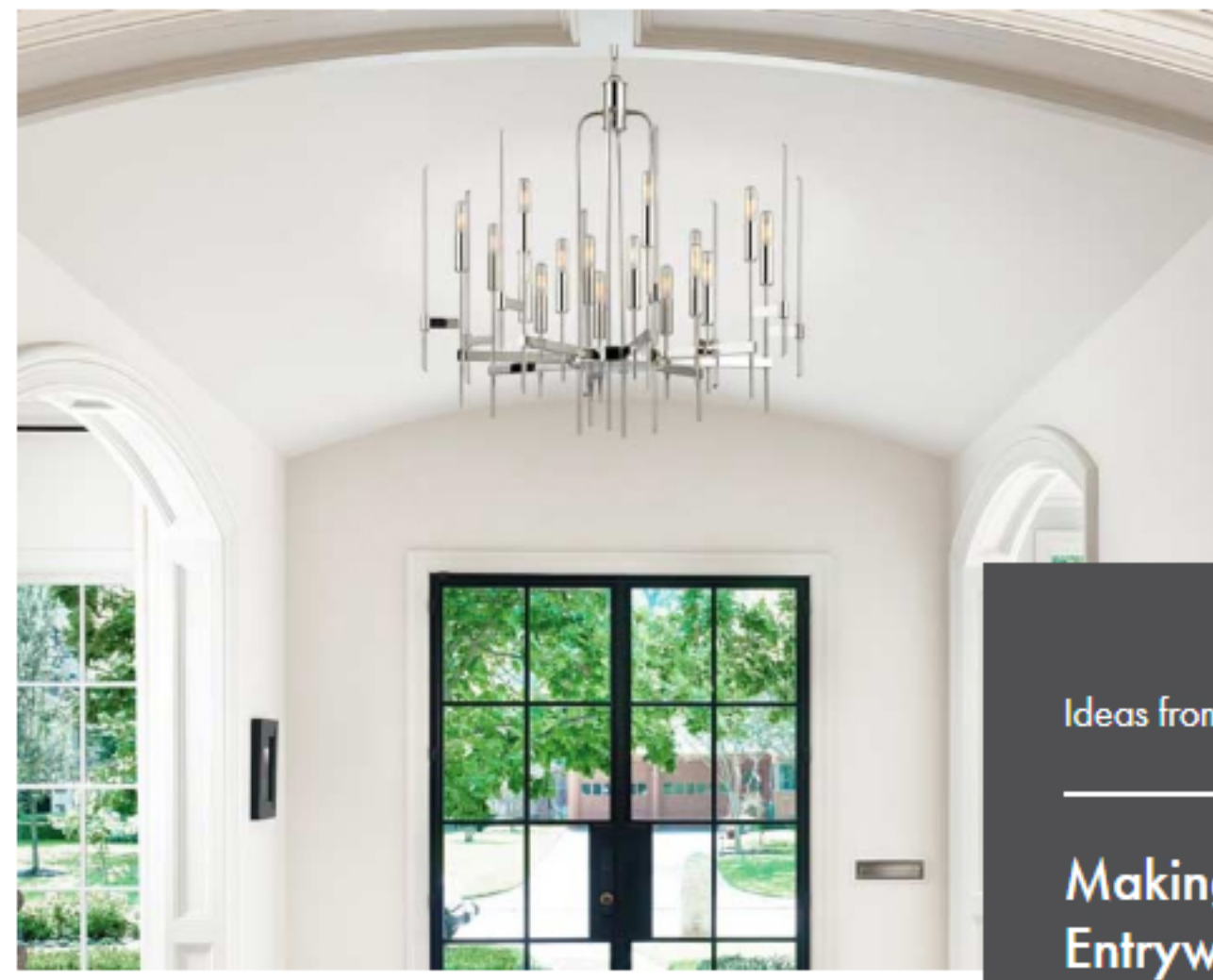
## Entryways

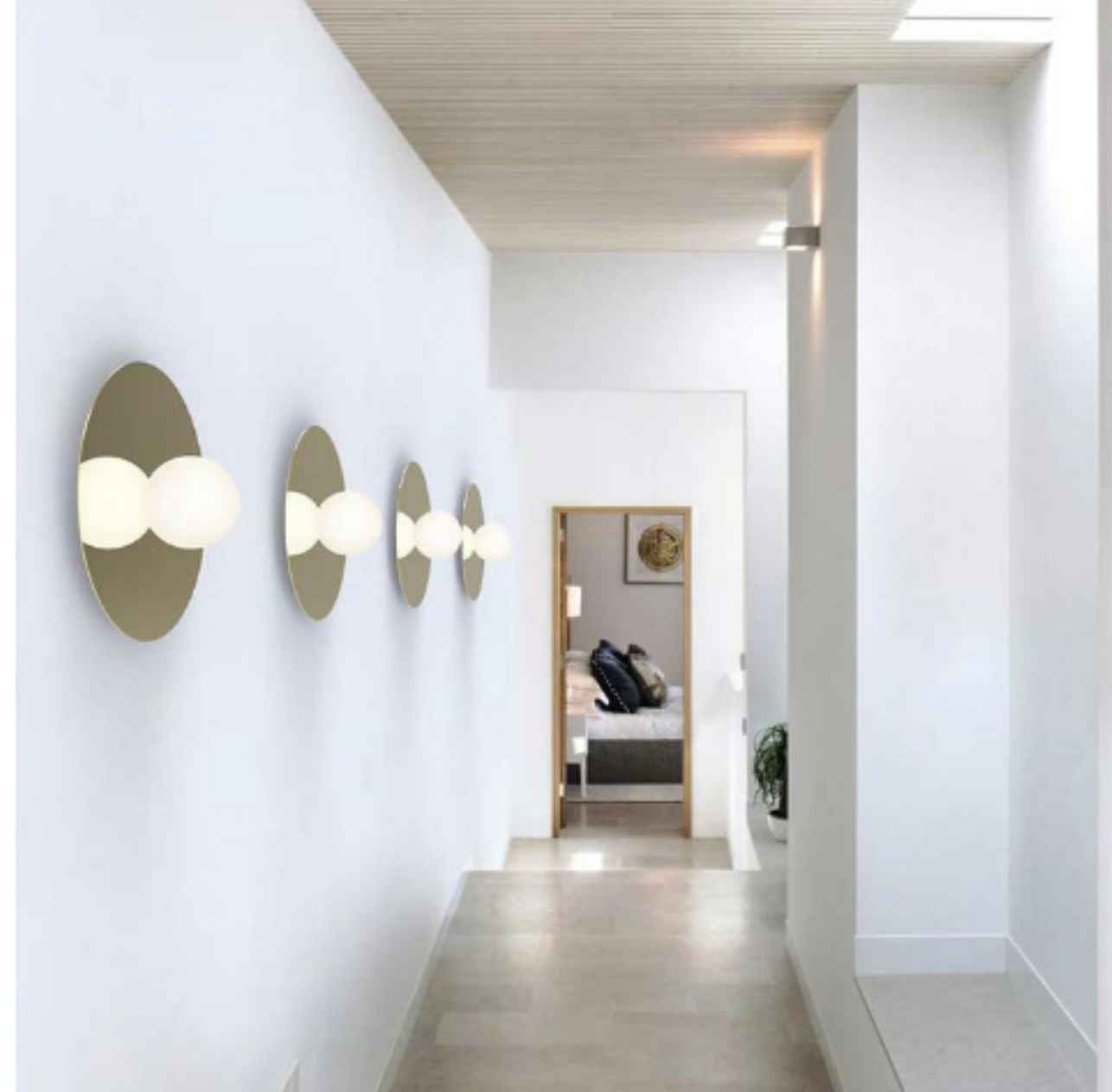

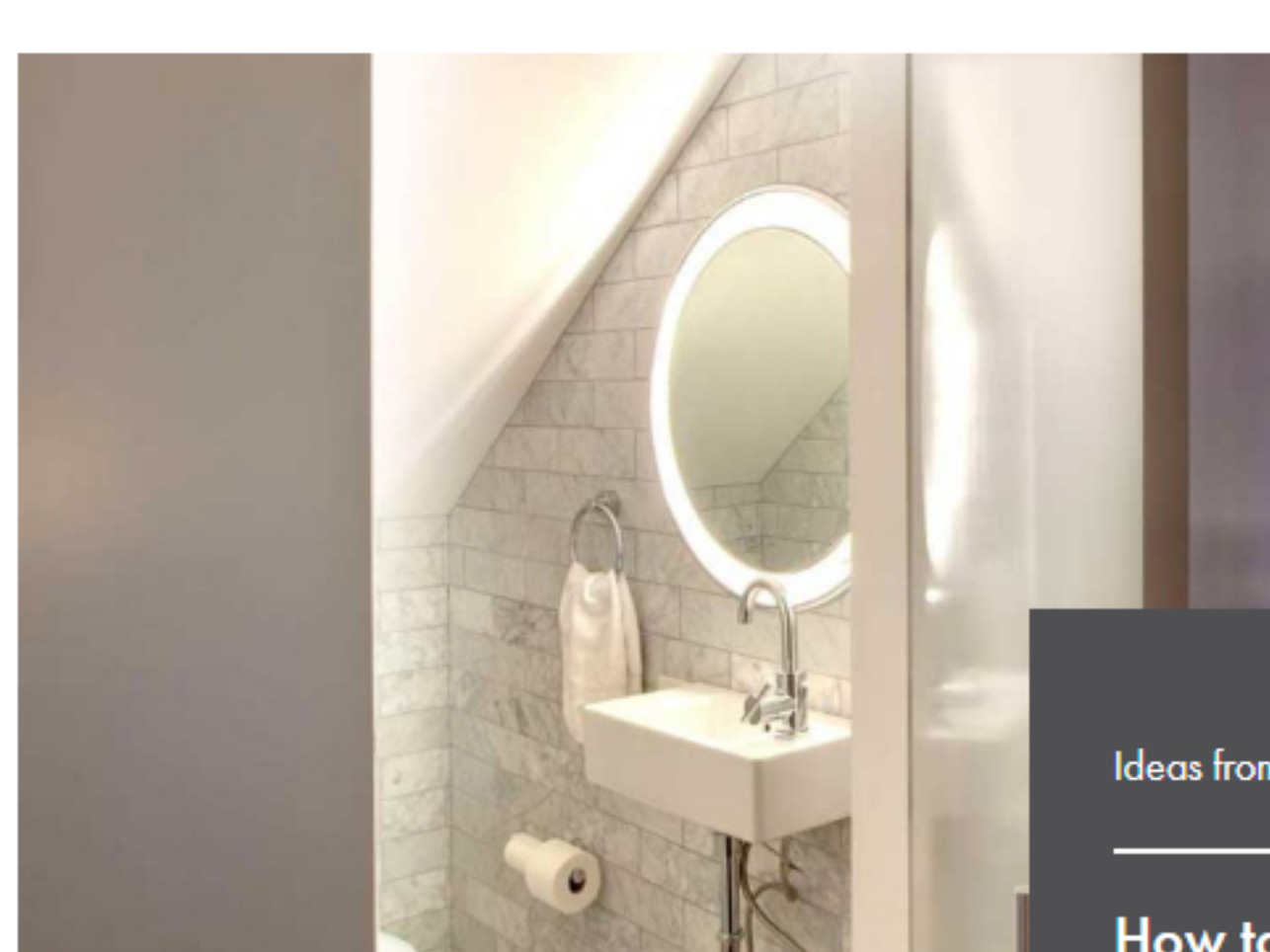
## Guest Bath
